Moseley Road Baths



An iconic Birmingham landmark with national historical and architectural significance, Moseley Road Baths is one of only three Grade II* listed swimming pools still in use in the UK.

Standing proudly with its red brick exterior, the Edwardian baths opened in 1907 with two public swimming pools and slipper baths in the heart of Balsall Heath. Whilst many of the original features remain intact, the building has been under threat of closure for decades due to underfunding and the scale of ongoing maintenance.

Major structural problems saw the Gala Pool close in August 2003, but it was the local authority's decision to shut the building in March 2017, as part of the city's new leisure strategy, that led Moseley Road Baths Action Group to step in to prevent local swimming being lost forever.

A successful application to the Bright Ideas Fund matched the group to approved business consultants Development in Social Enterprise CIC (DISE) who had previously assisted Castle Vale Library and Castle Vale Pool move into community management. »

>> DISE worked with the group to develop a viable proposal to keep swimming open at Mosely Road Baths using a part-staffed and part-volunteer model which was already working at Castle Vale Pool and community run leisure facilities elsewhere.

The business plan formed the basis of discussions with Birmingham City Council which subsequently saw the newly formed Moseley Road Baths CIO secure a licence to operate from 1st April 2018.

Chair of Moseley Road Baths CIO, Karen Leach said: "DISE's experience of assisting similar community enterprises within Birmingham gave us the confidence that we had an achievable business plan that would satisfy the Council's requirements and ensure that our greatly valued local heritage swimming facility remains for the benefit of local people."

DISE continued to provide advice and support which led to additional funding for business development to operationalise the business plan, recruit volunteers, fundraise, train lifeguards, and promote to users.

Around 50 volunteers and nine staff members manage the pool which is open seven days a week and used by the community, schools and swimming clubs. It is envisaged that after three years the facility will be operating at full capacity, producing an annual surplus and reaching around 20,000 local residents.

Dave Lane, Managing Director of DISE said: "Safeguarding swimming at this magnificent building will increase the likelihood of wider investment to develop this community asset for future generations, and further demonstrates the power of community led partnerships to save local services."

Birmingham City Council is continuing to invest in the service whilst a longerterm solution for the site is developed by a coalition led by the National Trust together with Historic England, World Monuments Fund, Birmingham City Council, Friends of Moseley Road Baths, and Moseley Road Baths CIO.
